# THE PROJECT

The **EUnvironment** project focuses on disseminating the results of the project and promoting the digital tools that will be developed, all aimed at enhancing knowledge and promoting sustainable behaviors among youth. These tools include a dictionary for environmental terminology, MOOC courses on climate policies, comics, and board games, all designed to engage young people in an informal and enjoyable learning experience. Additionally, an Educational Guide for youth workers will help improve teaching methods and enhance their professional profiles, aligning with non-formal learning frameworks to build key competences.

To support the use of these tools, multiplier events will be organized to train youth workers in integrating them into their daily work, ultimately increasing young people's interest in the project's sustainability-focused themes. The coordinator will submit progress reports to the ERASMUS+ National Agency, and partners are expected to provide timely and high-quality documentation to support these reports.

# HOW TO GET THERE



The easiest way to get to Piraeus from Athens International Airport (Eleftherios Venizelos) is by metro.

Take Metro line 3 (Blue Line) from the airport. The metro station is located within the airport and you can follow signs directing you to it. Board the metro heading towards “Dimotiko Theatre”.

If your accommodation is located near the port, you can either walk there from the metro or take a taxi.
